## Renaissance Music Academy Coronavirus Outreach Videorecording project #3 October 2020

## **Project Description**

RMA students are invited to participate in a video recording project during this time of online lessons. This project not only helps student motivation, it also gives students and RMA a great opportunity to reach out into the community and share music at this time. Additionally, it can give students and parents a deeper sense of the value and significance of being able to play a musical instrument, and the joy and comfort it can bring to others.

Video project #3 will be for public school teachers and staff. Students should thank teachers and staff in their introductory speech prior to their performance.

## **Deadline for submission**

Deadline to submit a recording to **your private lesson teacher** to participate in this video project is **Friday, October 23, 2020, at 5PM**. Recordings should be uploaded on Youtube if possible and then the link shared with your teacher. If you have questions about how to do that, please ask your teacher for help. Teachers must approve their students' performance, and then the teacher will email Teresa the Youtube link. The best device to use for recording is your cell phone. If you have other ways to record good quality sound, that can work too. The recording should be VIDEO recording, not just audio.

## **Student Guidelines**

Students should dress up for the video performance, just like in a recital. If your feet are in the video, please wear nice shoes. Students should say their name, (first name only) age, and how long they have studied. They need to introduce the name and composer of their piece, and say a few words about the music, or about playing an instrument, what they like about it, what is hard or fun, or give well wishes and a thank you to the public school teachers and staff for all of their hard work at this time. Students should practice the speaking part ahead of time so that it is clear, and slow, and understandable. If helpful, they can write out what they will say. Parents can help them practice this. Parents, please make sure that your child speaks loudly enough with the volume set on average level of volume.

There is no time limit, but only one piece for now, one movement.
